Requesting an Address

Properties located inside the City of Hempstead having a block and lot will need to go through the City Hall for a new address.

City of Hempstead - 1125 Austin St - 979-826-2486

Properties located inside the City of Waller will need to go through the City Hall for a new address.

City of Waller - 2206 Main St - 936-372-3880

To request a 9-1-1 address in the other cities (Brookshire, Katy, Prairie View, Pattison, Town of Pine Island) and Waller County you will need to know the property identification number (PID), sometimes referred to as an R#. This number can be found on tax statements from the Waller County Appraisal District. Knowing this number when you apply for your 9-1-1 address will expedite the process. You can also visit the Waller County Appraisal District website and search for the PID if you do not have a copy of your tax statement.

Once the request is made and the 9-1-1 address is assigned, we will notify you by email (if provided) or U.S. Postal Service. The Waller County Appraisal District and U.S. Postal Service will also be notified. It is the homeowners responsibility for notifying others of your new address.

A 9-1-1 address is for 9-1-1 services ONLY.

Your address will NOT be valid for any future construction until all permits are obtained.
