****The purpose of this position is to perform medical screening for intake of inmates, access health care needs of inmates, dispense medication as prescribed and needed, coordinate with jail staff for scheduling or appointments for inmate with healthcare providers. In addition, perform medial tests within scope of license, maintain accurate medical charts and related paperwork, and be on-call in response to medical emergencies at the jail.**

Primary Job Duties

- Under authority of the Jail Medical Director and direction of the Jail Medical Supervisor, the Jail Medic is responsible for providing emergent, non-emergent, and chronic care medical practices for all inmates confined in the Waller County Jail.

After receiving a conditional offer of employment, applicant must pass a drug screen and may need a physical agility test before becoming an employee of Waller County.
